Becoming a member

The congregation welcomes both local, resident members and international non-resident members.

Jews who are of age under civil law and have notified the secretary in writing of their wish to be registered as a member are eligible for membership in accordance with the stipulations in the formal regulations of Congregation Mikvé Israel-Emanuel from which the following are informally extracted.

Applications for membership are immediately upon receipt notified to the Board by the secretary. At its next meeting, the Board will consider the application and send it to the Council of Elders for advice. The Council of Elders will have the opportunity to raise any objections to the Board against the application. The Board will take a final decision on the application.

The membership of an adult member of a family is also deemed to imply the membership of the Jewish minor children belonging to that family, unless the register of members states otherwise.

In case of doubt whether someone is a Jew or a Jewess, a rabbinic judgment is required. Such judgment should be provided by the spiritual leader of the Congregation.

The Board may charge a membership fee, known as *finta*, per family.

Membership expires by a.o. by written notice of termination by the member to the secretary, no later than three (3) months before the end of the calendar year; by joining or entering into a non-Jewish denomination or converting to a religion other than the Jewish one; by death.
